Many of the qualities people enjoy about country living result directly from farming—the scenery, rural lifestyle, and availability of fresh food are wonderful benefits of living near farms. In Central Saanich, 60 per cent of land is in the Agricultural Land Reserve! The District plays a big role in regional food security, but farming is similar to other industries in that it can come with disturbances such as odour, noise, dust and can be a source of other nuisances.

Farming is an important local livelihood and is helping address food security concerns for the community. To strengthen farming locally, public education is needed to understand the needs of farmers and help avoid conflict between farms and their neighbours.

As the active farming season gets underway, you may have questions or concerns about farming activities.

## **Current Projects**

- Benvenuto pathway From Wallace to the base of Benvenuto, this pathway will improve safety of those traveling from the bus stop or walking this portion of the road.
- School zone improvements—The proposed work includes the construction of new crosswalks with flashing lights, as well as several hundred metres of sidewalk extensions at Wallace/Marchant between Brentwood Elementary and Bayside Middle School and at Central Saanich Road by Keating Elementary.
- **New bus shelters** Each year the District works to upgrade bus shelters—a list of priority locations is available on our website.

# Upfront costs of heat pumps paid back on property taxes

Nineteen homeowners in Central Saanich are replacing their oil heating systems with an electric heat pump thanks to 0%-interest financing through the District, made possible by a grant from the Federation of Canadian Municipalities. The District provides a loan of up to \$12,000 to help homeowners install a heat pump. The interest-free loan is then repaid on property tax bills over 10 years.

Homeowners can also take advantage of available rebates. If you are a homeowner in the District currently using heating oil and would like to take part in this program, please let us know by contacting us at support@ CSHeatPumpFinancing.ca or 250.652.4444.

This program is offered for a limited time on a first come first served basis with the next intake deadline mid-May.



Space heating is the largest use of energy in homes. A properly installed heat pump is 2-3X more efficient than other alternatives.

# Interested in a heat pump but not on oil?

There are many rebates programs available from BC Hydro, Clean BC and the federal government to help you make the switch off of fossil fuels; see **BetterHomesBC.ca** and/or contact a Clean BC Energy Coach at: 1-844-881-9790.



The District is offering a \$350 top-up to CleanBC Better Homes and Home Renovation Rebate Program participants that switch from a fossil-fuel (oil, natural gas, or propane) hot water tank to a more energy efficient electric heat pump water heater. Please expect your tax notice by mail around the end of May; if you have not received it by early June, contact us at 250.544.4206. Pay on time to avoid a 10% penalty on your property



# Set up monthly property tax payments for future tax years!

The property tax pre-authorized withdrawal program allows you to pre-pay your next year's property taxes. A flat amount is automatically withdrawn from your bank account on the 15th of each month from July through May. To register visit:

**CSaanich.ca/PropertyTax** or visit Municipal Hall and fill out the Pre-authorized Payment Plan Agreement application (and return it to the Hall).

### **PROPERTY TAX DEFERMENT**

What is property tax deferment? The province has a low interest loan program that helps qualified BC homeowners pay their property taxes on their principal resident.
